



SAMPLE RESIDENT LOG

Documenting your efforts to address second-hand smoke infiltrating your home

You can use this form to document when the smoke enters your home from a neighbouring unit, and everything you do or say to resolve the problem, including talking to your neighbours, property manager or strata council. This information will be useful when approaching your strata council to show how serious the problem is and how often the smoke enters your home. It will also be important if your council refuses to take action to address the problem and you are forced to take more formal steps.

Be sure to include dates and names of all people that you communicate with, and be sure to keep copies of all correspondence.

When documenting each incident, answer the following questions:

1. Where is smoke coming from and how it is entering your home? Include dates and times.
2. How is the smoke affecting your health or your family's health?
3. How is the smoke interfering with the use and enjoyment of your home?
4. What have you done to try to rectify the problem (communications or steps taken, i.e. sealing cracks and gaps)?
5. What was the outcome?
